Skills for Clean Growth: Waste Management – Workshop

Introduction

This workshop is aimed at supporting businesses involved in the production, use or distribution of physical products (as opposed to primarily service or digital based businesses) to improve waste management and reach sustainability objectives. Areas covered will include context of how waste management fits with the transition to Net Zero, key concepts in waste management, the regulatory and legislative environment, an introduction to the circular economy and practical steps needed to take action including case studies from across a range of industries.
